

The aims for this session are to focus on the hidden dangers of social media, online gaming, online predators, cyberbullying, and identity theft. Our objectives are for each young person to:

- 1. Understand the risks of being online.
- Understand what cyberbullying is and the impact and consequences of online bullying.



May 2024 Year 5 Road Safety

The children had a 45 minute workshop where they were spoken with about elements of road safety, such as the Green Cross code and how you would safely navigate your way across a busy road, sometimes with parked cars as obstacles. The children then had the opportunity in small groups to put their learning into practise in the big wide world...well in Dunkirk Road!
